SAFETY IMPROVEMENT PROJECT IN DANA POINT AT I-5 AND CAMINO LAS RAMBLAS / SR-1 TO START SOON

Irvine—The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) will be starting a safety improvement project at the intersection of PCH (Camino Las Ramblas) and the I-5 southbound off-ramp in the city of Dana Point.

The project will improve the sight distance at this intersection by removing 215 ft of concrete median barrier, fill and re-grade the median with Class 2 aggregate sub-base asphalt, paint 12 inch diagonal white stripes, and relocate the existing crash cushions 200 ft back from its present location.

This project is anticipated to last about 45 working days, tentatively beginning in Mid March 2012 and ending before Memorial Day. The demolition of the existing concrete median will be during the day for noise considerations, all other construction work will be conducted at night with one southbound lane closure. At least one lane will be open in each direction at all times. The placement of temporary K-rail and crash cushions is needed for all construction activities.
